

Mary Frances Kennedy Fisher (1908-92) was one of the most original and widely admired food writers of the 20th century. Often compared with her English contemporary Elizabeth David, with whom she shared a love of continental cuisine, Fisher was a wit, a poet and a philosopher of food, who bathed American kitchens in Mediterranean sunshine, relieving the boredom and austerity of the post-war years, and whose intimate, extremely funny books were lauded like those of few other cookery writers. Food was her metaphor for life, and her appetite for both was voracious.
