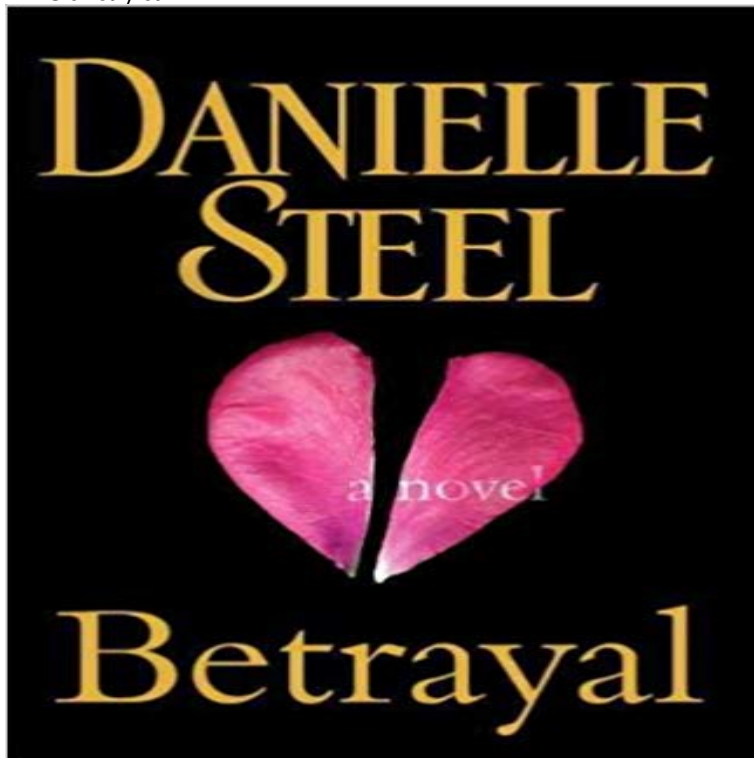


## Betrayal
