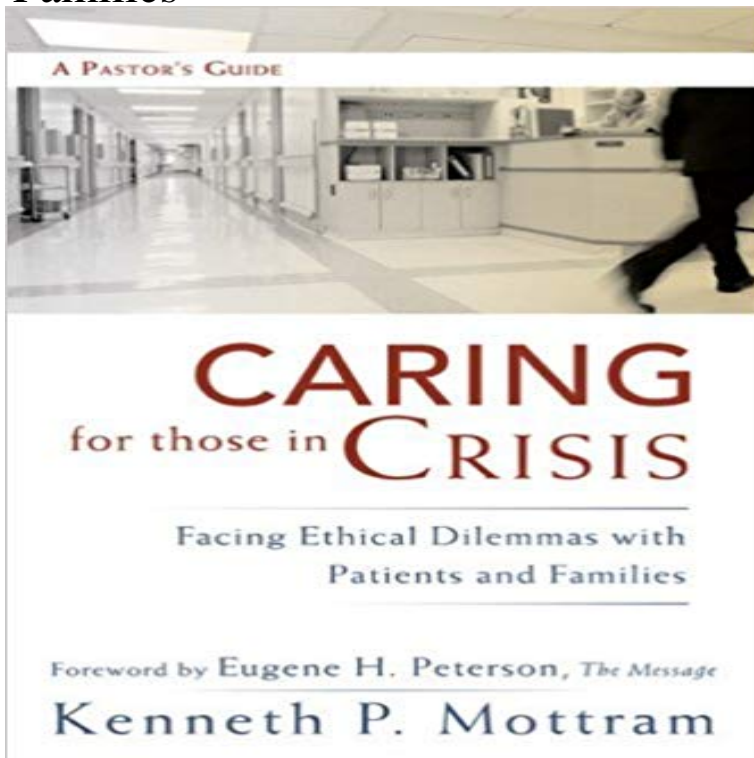


Caring for Those in Crisis: Facing Ethical Dilemmas with Patients and Families
