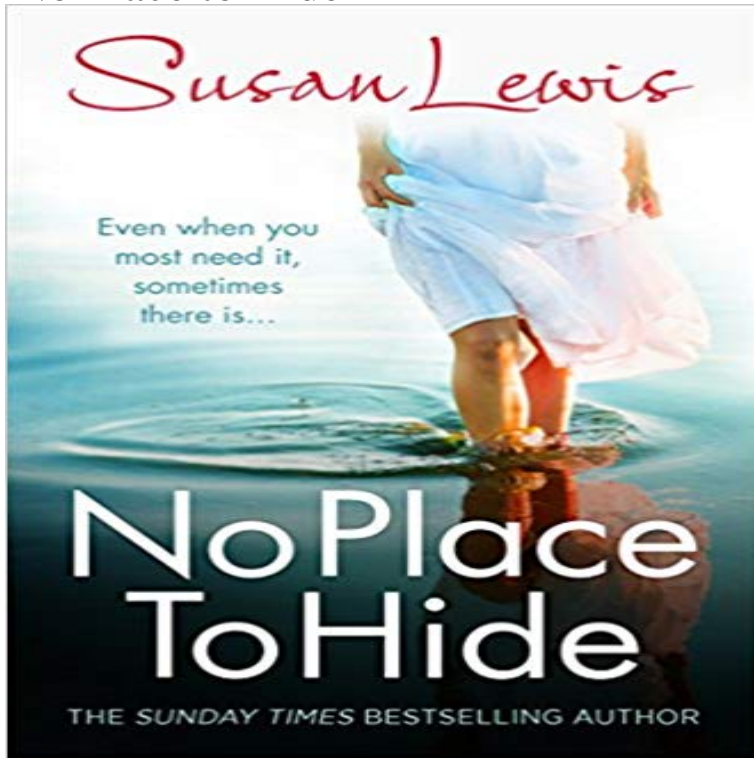


## No Place to Hide
