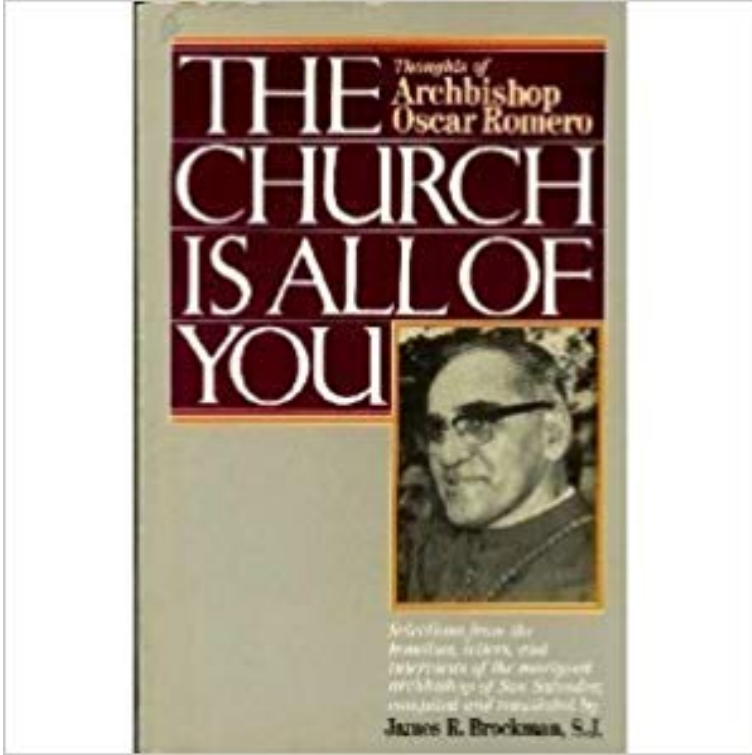


The Church Is All of You: Thoughts of Archbishop Oscar A. Romero

Oscar Arnulfo Romero y Galdamez (15 August 1917 – 24 March 1980) was a prelate of the Roman Catholic Church in El Salvador. He is also one of the ten 20th-century martyrs depicted in statues above the altar of the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City. If all this has happened to persons who are the most evident representatives of the Church, you can guess what has happened to this new bishop. He was the Archbishop of San Salvador from 1977 until he was assassinated in 1980. The peasants you kill are your own brothers and sisters, he preached. We can all celebrate Romero's legacy by following his example: by supporting the work of CAFOD, which also helped to fund the support given by the Church to the poor. So, what were the dangerous ideas Archbishop Oscar Romero espoused? Historically, some sectors of the Christian church have been active in social justice work. It is high time you recovered your consciences and obeyed your consciences rather than a government. August 15th is Archbishop Oscar Romero's birthday - he would have been 100 years old. Each one of you has to be God's microphone. Each one of you has to be a messenger, a prophet. The church will always exist as long as there is someone who has a voice. Peace is the generous, tranquil contribution of all to the good of all.⁸⁴ What I am pointing to is not the discipline of coercion but its antidote, to be quoted in *The Church is all of You: Thoughts of Archbishop Oscar Romero*, trans. Oscar Romero gave his last homily on March 24. The poor never expected him to take their side and the elites of church and state felt betrayed. If they kill all the priests and the bishop too, and you are left a people without a shepherd. By becoming an extraordinary pastor, Oscar Romero focused the world's attention on the poor.
