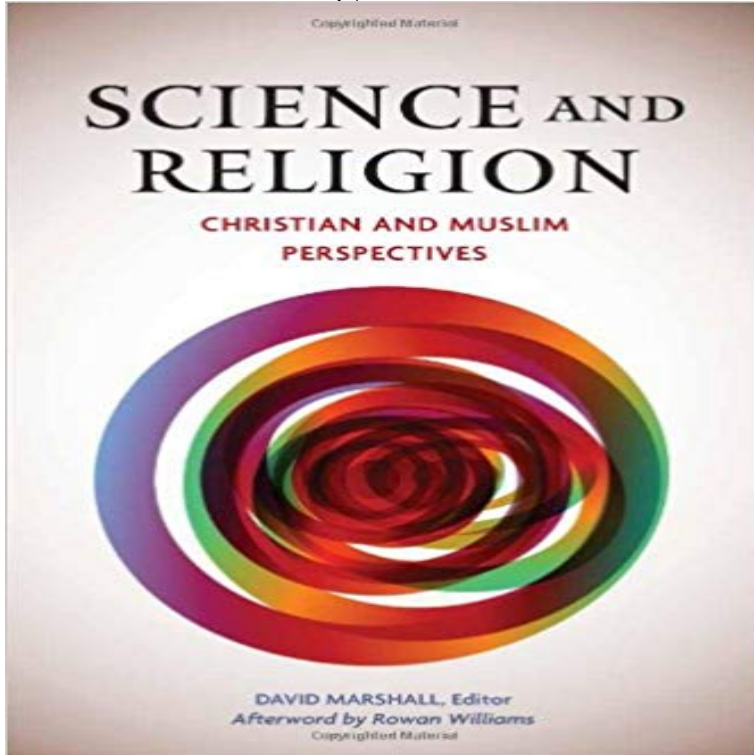


Science and Religion: Christian and Muslim Perspectives
