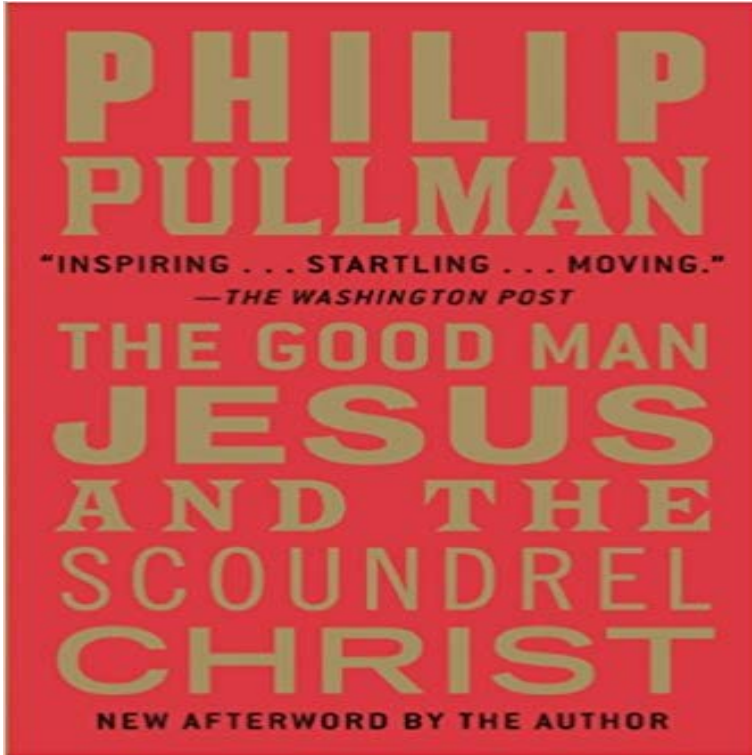


The Good Man Jesus and the Scoundrel Christ
