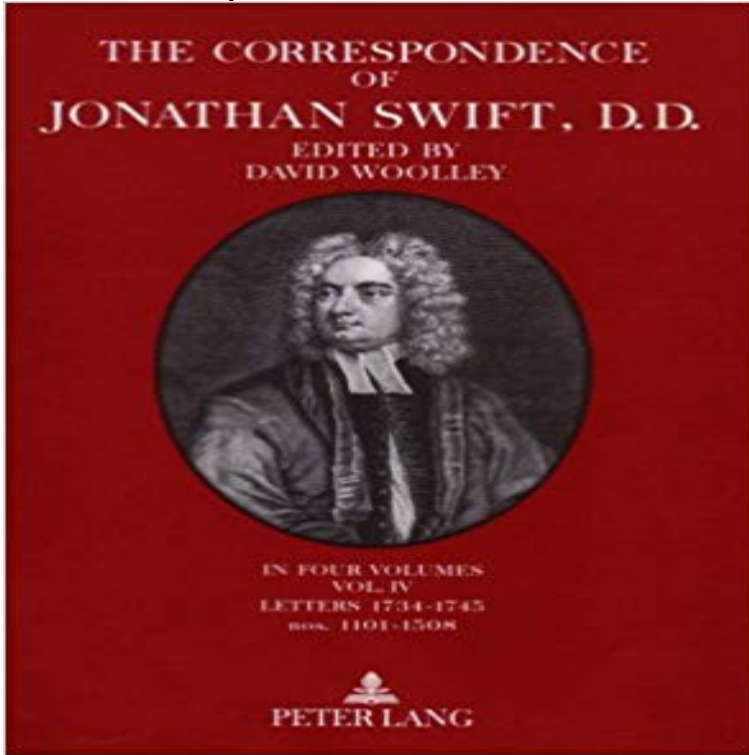


The Correspondence of Jonathan Swift; Volume II
