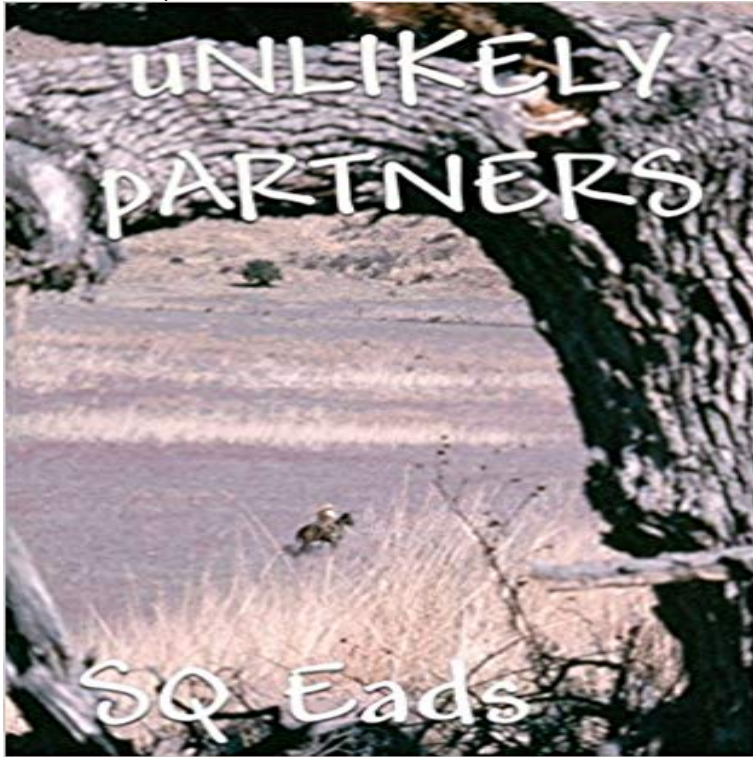


Unlikely Partners
